## Latin I

The new Latin I course uses the Cambridge series for study, which includes the text, workbook practice exercises, audio comprehension and pronunciation discs, the course syllabus, and access to the Cambridge University Press website. The Cambridge Latin course introduces the language through an exciting storyline that follows a typical household in Pompeii during Roman times. The student concentrates on reading and understanding the stories in Latin, which at the same time present the basic concepts of the language. The course includes a strong emphasis on word derivation and background information on Roman life, architecture, culture, and art. Access to the Wikipedia encyclopedia is also available through the Cambridge site.
