DISTANCE LEARNING

Enrolled students work one-to-one with our teachers using our print-based curriculum and online resources over a 10-month period. Students submit work on a regular basis. Teachers provide consistent feedback, customization, instruction, and support via Google platform, Zoom, email, and phone.

GRADING

Our assessment includes comprehensive narrative evaluation. Teachers provide two evaluations per year, one at the end of each semester. We do not calculate class rank. GPA is unweighted. Students must earn a minimum of 67% to receive credit for a course.
