Science Year-End Assessment

Read through the entire assessment before you begin so that you can more easily plan how to conduct your assessment.

Observational skills

• Visit your special tree and ask your child to note any changes.

- Ask your child to point out signs of animal activity around the tree.
- On a nature walk, ask your child to collect objects that share a similar attribute. For instance, you might ask for two long sticks, or for three different kinds of yellow flowers, or for two flat rocks.

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Descriptive skills

- When visiting your special tree, sit down with your eyes closed and ask your child to look up at the tree and describe it in detail, pretending that you have never seen it before. Then, ask your child to look around and spot a different tree to describe while your eyes are still closed. Afterward, open your eyes and try to find the second tree that your child described.
- Switch places with your child and have them close their eyes while you describe a different tree nearby. Have your child look around and try to spot the tree you described, based on your description.
- When you get home, ask your child to draw a picture of the special tree, encouraging them to include specific details that were noticed.

Predictions and comparisons

- While you are outside this week, discuss the weather with your child. Ask them how today's weather compares with yesterday's weather. Is it the same? Is it different? If so, how?
- Ask your child to guess what the weather might be like tomorrow. See if they can explain their reasoning. What might it be like next week? Why?

- Together with your child, recall the different ways in which your seasonal table has changed over the year. Ask them to guess what kinds of things might be available for the seasonal table during the coming season.
- On a nature walk, collect several samples of a particular object (for instance, several leaves, flowers, acorns, or sticks). Lay the items out side by side and have your child point out ways in which the items are similar. Next, ask how they are different.
